The Grand Master Asks for Prayers for His Holiness, Benedict XVI

he Grand Master, Cardinal John Foley, requested special prayers for His Holiness, Benedict XVI in this time of travail for the Vatican. The Archdiocese of Miami Section responded by organizing two Masses celebrated at both St. Henry and Church of the Good Shepherd on Sunday, June 27, 2010.

Archbishop Favalora Retires

rchbishop John C. Favalora, KC*HS, retired as the Archbishop of the Miami diocese in June. Archbiship Favalora headed the archdiocese since 1994. On November 3, 1994, Bishop Favalora received his third episcopal appointment as the third Archbishop. He was installed as Archbishop on December 20, 1994 at the Cathedral of Saint Mary in Miami where he also serves as the pastor. Favalora serves as a member of the Board of Trustees at The Catholic University of America and St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary in Boyn-

ton Beach. He serves as State Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus in addition to being President of the Florida Catholic Conference. He is a member of the USCCB committees on Priestly Life and Ministry, Sexual Abuse and Pro-Life issues.

On Sunday, May 16, 2010, Archbishop Favalora presided at Solemn Vespers at the Cathedral of Saint Mary. This was an opportunity for the Religious and laity of the Archdiocese to pray with and for Archbishop Favalora as he prepared for retirement.

Welcome to the New Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Miami

rchbishop Thomas G. Wenski of Orlando has been named fourth archbishop of Miami. He is the only Florida native serving as a bishop in the state. Archbishop Wenski, the son of a Polish immigrant, speaks fluent Spanish and Creole. He learned Spanish while in the seminary, listening to Cuban radio and "hanging out" with exiles in Hialeah. He learned Creole in Haiti a few years after being ordained a priest and perfected it during 18 years of circuit-riding ministry to Haitians from Homestead to Belle Glade. Before becoming Archbishop of Orlando, Archbishop Wenski served the Miami archdiocese from 1975 to 2004.

Besides his duties in the Archdiocese of Miami, where he served on numerous boards including Catholic Hospice, Catholic Charities, Catholic Charities Legal Services, and St. Thomas University, and later as Coadjutor Bishop and Ordinary of Orlando, he also served as chair of CLINIC (Catholic Legal Immigration Network, Inc.) (1998-2001), chair of the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops' Committee on Migration (2001-

2004); and chair of the conference's Committee on International Policy (2004-2008) and currently he continues as a consultant to the Committee on Migration, and a member of the Conference's Secretariat for the Church in Latin America, the committee for International Justice and Peace, and CLINIC (Catholic Legal Immigration Network, Inc.). On behalf of his work on these committees, he has traveled to the Congo and the Great Lakes region of Africa, the Caribbean, and Central and South America as well as to Israel and the West Bank (Palestinian Authority).

In June 2009, Bishop Wenski was elected to a four-year term on the Board of Trustees of The Catholic University of America. April 20, 2010, Pope Benedict XVI appointed him the fourth archbishop of Miami and Archbishop-designate Wenski was installed June 1 at St. Mary Cathedral. At the end of June, he traveled to Rome to receive the pallium—the symbol of his office as Metropolitan Archbishop of the Province of Florida—from Pope Benedict XVI.
